

## PROPOSALS FOR ENVIRONMENTAL PRESERVATION

- Issue for every child born, a certificate which states the place of birth, parents' residence, climate and environmental conditions of the birthplace, in order to use this data in the child's future life, e.g. during medical treatment, etc.
- Develop, publish and distribute throughout the world, the elementary rules of human behaviour in dealing with nature and the environment. The existing harmful results of human activity should also be listed, along with any potential environmental disaster that might take place in the near future.
- Disclose and explain the relationship between many dangerous illnesses of humankind, especially of children, and the non-observance of the main environmental rules.
- Request that the populations of all continents, States and nations that they appeal to their governments to protect and preserve the environment.
- Organise an international children's movement for environmental protection. To create attractive logos and to establish symbolic prizes for participation and outstanding results. To co-operate with UNICEF in this regard.
- Evaluate the losses to humankind due to the misuse of the environment. These losses should be measured both economically and physiologically.
- Recommend to the governments of the members of the United Nations Organisation, the establishment of special internal structures, with no payment to be involved, for the promotion of environmental protection.
- Establish a specialised publishing house that will develop environmental literature for children, youth and adults.
- Promote legal proceedings against individuals, companies and governments for gross violation of environmental norms in an International Court and to evoke social pressures on them.
- Actively advertise bio-environmental activities, in mass media, throughout the world.
