## XVth Annual Youth Bios Olympiad 2010

## St. Petersburg, September 17–21

More than 400 children and young adults gathered last week in St. Petersburg, Russia, to take part in the XVth Annual Youth Bios Olympiad, sponsored by the Biopolitics International Organisation (B.I.O.). This year's event also featured a Jubilee Celebration with the participation of distinguished international personalities and honoured guests.

The Youth Bios Olympiads are realised annually by Prof. Agni Vlavianos Arvanitis, B.I.O. President and Founder, in cooperation with the Russian Academy of Sciences, the Saint Petersburg Scientific Centre and the Interregional Ecological Club of the Baltic Ladoga Region. The initiative owes its great success to the unwavering efforts of Prof. Alexander Shishkin, Head of the Ecological Standardisation Laboratory at the St. Petersburg State Technological University for Plant Polymers.

The goal of the XVth Youth Bios Olympiad 2010 was to consolidate biopolicy and bioculture in future generations. Its mission was to inspire the young to address environmental and biopolicy issues, and to introduce a bios-promoting spirit for the development of a "Green Society" through bio-environmental, bio-cultural and bioathletic values.

President of Romania; **Erol User**, President and CEO of USER Corporation Turkey and special sponsor of the event; **Dr. Stylianos Syrmoglou**, Chairman and CEO, and **Michael Poulakis**, Head of the Programming and Planning Department, of Citizen in Deed, Greece; **Dr. Theoharis Provatakis**, f. Secretary General of the Greek Ministry of Culture; Prof. **Athanassios Angelopoulos**, President of the

Institute for National and Religious Affairs, Greece; Anna Karamanou, f. Member of the European Parliament; Dimitrios Koutroulas, Director of the Institute for National and Religious Affairs, Greece; Maria Paraschaki, Consultant at the Regional Management Authority of Crete, Greece; Claudia Lolas and Prof. Eileen Hoesly from the Hellenic American University; and, Prof. Ivana Djujic from the University of Belgrade. Also present were the following B.I.O. staff members: Elena Efraimiadou, Geologist, and Vassileia Pitarokoili, Laywer.

The XVth Youth Bios Olympiad **opened with a spectacular ceremony** on September 18, at the **White Hall of the Saint Petersburg State Polytechnic University**. The event featured the symphonic and choral Cantata "Life on Earth," composed by Iakovos Dakoutros after a poem by Prof. Agni Vlavianos Arvanitis. Speeches and greetings by members of the St. Petersburg administration and honoured guests followed, and the opening ceremony concluded with a music festival organised by the young participants.

The second day consisted of a plenary session where more than 240 young students presented reports before the members of the International Jury. Participants ranged from grade-school children to university students and presented a multitude of creative projects. Thematic sections involved the protection of biodiversity, the ecological assessment of the environment, the medical and social problems of ecology, as well as international cooperation in bio-environmental protection. The presentations of the young participants were of a very high caliber and drew great interest from the attendees. On the same day, at the university showrooms, the young students also presented creative works, photographs, drawings, environmental essays, posters and video films. The crafts were made from many different kinds of material, such as wood, textile, glass, sand and flowers.

The XVth Youth Bios Olympiad concluded on September 20, at the **Russian Academy of Sciences**, with a scientific seminar themed "Ladoga–Neva–Gulf of Finland: cooperation for the protection of water resources." The impressive **Closing Ceremony** which followed the seminar included speeches by leading personalities, a folk art performance, and the award of diplomas and prizes to the finalists by a panel of international dignitaries.

All events were crowned with great success and contributed to an increased awareness of the importance of bio-environmental and bio-cultural values in building tomorrow's society.
