

GOALS OF B.I.O.

Purpose: To promote the “**Bios Theory**” by implementing the following:

- **international cooperation** for a better understanding of bios (life). Parallel to internal problems, nations will have an international task. Advanced nations could undertake a world **educational campaign** through communication **satellites** to increase public awareness.
- promote the development of international legislation on “**Bios Rights.**” It is important to realize that environmental deterioration constitutes a threat to all forms of bios. In view of recent technological advances, new dimensions of understanding are arising. Respect for bios may serve as the core of thinking and action, so as to provide a harmonious future for the world. Bios is a unifying force recognizing no ideological or geographical boundaries; no East-West, North-South or developed-developing countries. It provides the unifying force behind all forms of life.
- The **bio-assessment** of technology, a dialectic approach in examining potential perspectives in all fields of human endeavour in an effort to improve quality of life. Bios in the next millennium may thus benefit from the positive aspects of technological contributions and the center of gravity will be shifted from fear to hope. Greece is proposed as the ideal meeting place for people from all specialties to meet and assess progress and values. Scientists, academicians and philosophers, as well as every individual, may bequeath their thoughts to a “Bank of Ideas.”
- the **sensitization of public opinion** towards the ramifications of the biological sciences and the impact this progress may have on other fields of study (bio-diplomacy, bio-law, bio-economics, bio-art, bio-literature, bio-environment, etc.).
- development of **curriculum materials** for elementary, middle and higher levels of education. Universities and colleges are being encouraged to review their curricula and include Biopolitics in the study of theology, law, political science, the arts, business, economics, etc., since these fields are directly related to the biological sciences. Already, several universities have included Biopolitics as a course or major.
