The award ceremony was held on March 7, 2016, on the occasion of International Women's Day, at the Athens Concert Hall (Megaro Mousikis). The event, which met with unprecedented success, was organized by the Association's President, Kaiti Gakis Kapsis and facilitated by journalist Magda Tsengos.
